Six dangerous outcasts. One impossible heist. Together they might just be unstoppable – if they don't kill each other first.




### The 13 Problems by Agatha Christie

### **Unraveller by Frances Hardinge**



### I am David by Anne Holm


I am David and I belong to myself, and no one has any right over me.




### The Maze Runner by James Dashner


## **Shadowhunters: Clockwork Angel** by Cassandra Clare

It's up to Stanley to dig up the truth.



#### The Breadwinner by Deborah Ellis

Parvana's father is arrested, and under Taliban law, women and girls are not allowed to leave the house on their own. Parvana, her mother, and sisters are prisoners in their own home, and face starvation. Forbidden to earn money as a girl, Parvana must transform herself into a boy, and become the breadwinner to save her family. In fear, she goes out, and witnesses the horror of landmines, the brutality of the Taliban, and the desperation of a country trying to survive. But even in despair lies hope....



### The School of Good and Evil by Soman Chainani

Every four years two children are stolen away from Gavaldon, never to return. Most children fear being taken to the School for Good and Evil...not Sophie. Sophie has dreamt of being a Princess for all of her life and believes the school could give her that chance whilst her friend Agatha has other ideas. When the two girls are taken, things don't go quite to Sophie's plan. Sometimes the Princess and the witch don't look like they do in the fairytales.
